## Declaration

Conditions of the dog being granted permission to enter are:

- The dog being moved must be fully vaccinated, surgically desexed and healthy with written evidence from a vet supporting this.
- A tick treatment must be applied to the dog during the seven days before moving a dog. The tick treatment must be registered for brown dog tick (*Rhipicephalus sanguineus*) and applied according to the manufacturer's instructions.
- The person responsible for the dog must keep a record of the treatment for brown dog tick for six months after the movement.
- The person responsible for the dog must contact the ALC Rangers if the dog becomes unwell following movement or call the Emergency Animal Disease Hotline on 1800 675 888.
